# LITTLE MANOR DECT

Our Little Manor Play Project provides high quality, affordable wraparound care for children aged 5-12, and comprises of breakfast, after school and holiday provision. One parent said: 'the children do things they may never get to do anywhere else... they love every minute.'

### YOUTH4YOUTH

Our Youth4Youth Programme, funded by the National Lottery Community Fund, is a leadership programme for young people who live or study in Newham aged 16-21.

This year we recruited a diverse and motivated core group of young leaders who designed, planned and delivered a range of social action projects such as: One participant said: 'I have never done any type of course before to help my confidence, but I saw the Youth4Youth programme and thought it would be good for me. I have really loved it because I can now talk about things I am interested in and make society better with my friends and other people I come across...l really like other opportunities that have come from Youth4Youth and want to remain involved."



# THE FITTER FINANCES PROGRAME

Funded by the City Bridge Trust, our programme supports voluntary groups through improving their financial skills, knowledge and practice. From cultural and faith groups to youth charities and sports clubs, it has enabled voluntary groups to be financially resilient.

One of the groups we have supported is the Newham Chinese Association. Their Programme Coordinator explained 'we didn't know how to effectively fundraise, only doing it on a small scale...now as a team we are more confident, we don't give up on funding applications even if they are lengthy. It is very assuring to know that the Fitter Finances team are going to support us.'



## VOLUNTEERING WITH US








#### **INCOME & EXPENDITURE**
